I can ten tell you this ... if you needed advice or needed some help in any way, he was there for you. A very big-hearted, generous man and the "greatest" man I ever knew and loved! Last time I saw my dear brother was 2009. Stayed with him in Prattville til February 2010. Then it was time to head back home to Wisconsin. He told me to head home actually now mind you it wasn't that he tired of my company, but he knew I missed my grandson, Blayz. And he was right! I need to talk about our younger days. Ed was a driven young teenager to make money and hiss primary goal was to build his '57 Chevy into a dream of a car. It was an awesome car. White convertible with a blue metal flake tear drop on the hood. Everyone in eastern Wisconsin knew that car. He worked at a full-service gas station called Transport and! He worked with a construction crew at 15 years old as well from 5AM till 5-6PM. He would eat a quick supper and head right off to his job at Transport. ok, there was all that. He was also quite the ladies' man. Seemed he never had trouble getting a date with the young women he was attracted to. God! I loved my brother and once he joined the U.S. Air Force things just weren't the same. All our friends saved n=me from missing him a little and he always came home every year for his 30-day leave. The whole family and our friends always looked forward to Ed coming home for those 4 weeks. It was a true honor know how well my brother was doing in the USAF as a jet engine mechanic. F-15s, F-16s. He even gave me the thrill of my life one weekend i Phoenix Arizona 1985. We were supposed to go try to go golfing, but Ed was a a leader of men so when the work was needed to be done even if he was the only one working, he was THE MAN on the job. So I go to Luke AFB and go to the hanger area where they were the jet engine mechanics and there Ed was ready to fire up an F-16 trainer. He sees me and as I get out of mt car he hands me a helmet and asked me if I ever had the chance to sit in an F-16 while i was in the Air Force. My reply, no, you know we were a radar unit and I never wanted an

incentive flight in a B-52 bomber. Well, here is your chance. Put that helmet on and climb aboard. And don't touch anything thing damn thing might be armed and loaded with ammo. So, we climbed aboard and Ed fired that F-16 up for what they called a dry dock test to check the power of the jet propulsion system. I thought for sure that F-16 was ready to rock n roll. It was a serious thrill for me, and it was all because of Tech Seargent Ed Gurney my brother who ran the show at Luke AFB! How do I put into words how much I loved, enjoyed and endeared my brother Ed. My heart breaks knowing he has passed away. Loved, loved, loved him. Not many people know this but he was the bass guitar player in a 60's rock band (The Midnight Express with the Saeger brothers) and he was damn good at it too at 13 years old. Gotta go seeing my time at the library is running out. Love you Sarah, David, Derek and Brittney. and to all my family alove that will never end!!!

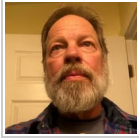
