HOFFMAN, Joseph Jan, 83, of Prattville, Alabama, passed away on Sunday, October 12, 2025.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Harry and Harriet Hoffman; his daughter, Aviva Hoffman; his first wife, Beryl Cohen, and his second wife, Vivian Hoffman.
