“ Maurice and Marie Anne have been on my mind frequently of late. My late husband and Mo were stationed at Ft. Wainwright, in Fairbanks, Alaska, along with our families. We shared earthquakes (when a large clock on the wall over their couch fell, but missed one of their girls by inches) and a flood, and many happy days, playing cards, sharing meals. Our two boys and their girls were playmates, along with the other children in our housing area. Mo and "Maryanne," as we called her, were funny, teased each other a lot, and were excellent neighbors. I am so saddened to realize they are both gone, and for so many years, because my memories of them are vivid, poignant and loving, and include many laughs, which means they lived longer for me than they really did.

I extend my most sincere condolences to their family, because they were two people who were really terrific. They loved their kids, and each other, totally, and made hard times a lot easier through their love and their sense of humor. I remember Mo teasing Maryanne about the Ford she bought while he was in Vietnam because it had 4 different sized tires. Yours is a serious loss, because they were two lovely people, and the world needs more like them.

My name at the time we all lived at Ft. Wainwright, in the 1960s, was Lynne Middleton. My husband was Herb Middleton, and our sons Eric and Keith. I remarried in 1979 and my name now is Lynne Burt-Jenkins, a combination of my birth name and my second husband's last name. Herb and he have both passed now, as has Eric, who was 4-6 years old when we all knew each other. So the losses are deeply felt. I include that information because no one we knew in Alaska would know me by that name, and I want their children to know this is a sincere remembrance of these two crazy, loving people.
