



Robert Wayne Scoggins

July 29, 1939 - August 16, 2020

Robert Wayne Scoggins, 83, passed away peacefully in his sleep on Sunday evening, August 16, 2020. He chose to be cremated and his immediate family held a small private service in his memory. Mr. Scoggins was preceded in death by his loving wife of 32 years, Pamela D. Scoggins, and his parents, Robert and Lola Grisham Scoggins of Starkville, Mississippi. He is survived by his only sister, Sharon Scoggins Weeks (Joe) of Prattville; niece, Kerissa Weeks Grigsby (Clay) of Prattville; nephew Randy Weeks of Prattville; great-niece, Meredith Grigsby Pepping (Miles); great-nephew, Ian Grigsby (Dayna); and great-niece, Elizabeth Grigsby. Wayne was born and raised near Starkville, Mississippi. He spent three years in the U.S. Army, two in France as a Military Policeman. He moved to California in 1967, where he met and married Pamela in 1976. Wayne and Pam spent most of their lives in the San Diego area with a change of residence to Boise, Idaho, for a short time. They returned to San Diego, where they lived until they retired and moved to Alabaster, Alabama, in 1998. The move to Prattville in 2008 was made so that family could help him care for Pamela who had become disabled. After her death shortly after the move, the neighbors on Hunts Alley and other friends in "The District" gave purpose to his life. He was very active in the Autauga County Heritage Association, devoting many hours to historical research and volunteering. He was an advocate of the downtown businesses, posting on Facebook to promote them. He was fondly referred to as "the Mayor of Hunts Alley". He contributed to the work of the Autauga Creek Improvement

Committee, as well. His family requests that memorials be made in his honor to the Autauga County Heritage Association or the Autauga Creek Improvement Committee.
