



Samuel Joseph Shippen

January 28, 1932 - April 12, 2013

Rev. Dr. Samuel Joseph Shippen born to Anna Lee Morgan and John Leroy Shippen on January 28, 1932 transitioned to eternal life on April 12, 2013. Devoted husband for 55 years, he is survived by his loving wife, Dorothy Fendley Shippen. Sam was called Daddy or Da by his children Matt Shippen, Dorothy Shippen (Jeff Kapler), Mark Shippen, Patty Wieters (Drew), Louis Shippen (Teresa), Peggy Shippen (Jennifer Mathis), and John Shippen (Rebecca). His grandchildren called him Grad: Ben, Madison, Chris, Matt, Simon, and Sam; step grandchildren Jennifer, David, and Amber; step great grandchildren Ethan, Bryant, and Hartley. He is survived by two sisters, Geraldine Wohl and Patricia Guy. He was Uncle Sam to scores of nieces, nephews, grand nieces, and grand nephews. He was Dr. Shippen or Deacon Sam to many students, counseling clients, church members, and incarcerated people. Sam loved flowers, especially those in prison gardens planted and tended by the inmates. In lieu of flowers he would be honored by support of the works of mercy: helping the hungry, homeless, mentally or physically ill, prisoners and ex-offenders, or by support of favorite causes: basic literacy, reconciliation, and restorative justice. Services directed by Prattville Memorial Chapel with visitation Sunday from 5-7 pm and Eucharistic Liturgy at 11 am Monday at St. Joseph's Catholic Church.

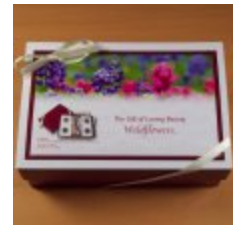
